# DAY TOUR #2 Tel-Aviv & the Coast

#### Tel-Aviv | Jaffa | Caesarea | Haifa

#### Sea of Galilee Golan Heights

# DAY TOUR #4 Dead Sea & Masada

#### Dead Sea | Masada | Qumran | Jericho

We will begin by visiting the ancient city of Jericho and Mt. of Temptation. We will continue to visit the site of Qumran, the place where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found (the most ancient copy of the Bible), more than 2,000 years ago. We will then go to Masada, the famous fortress that was built by King Herod the Great, more than 2,000 years ago and finish our day by swimming in the unique and famous Dead Sea, the lowest place in the world and the saltiest lake in the world.
